A local law amending Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Dolgeville, New York

I. Findings. The Board of Trustees finds that Article II, Section 10-20, of the Code of Ordinances regarding certain speed limits should be amended in order to address concerns which have arisen in particular areas of the Village.

II. Section 10-20. Section 10-20 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to fully read as follows until further amended by local law:

(a) Established. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motorcycle on South Helmer Avenue in the vicinity of the playgrounds between Baker Street and Cramer Lane, and on East Spofford Avenue between Howard Street and Ransom Street, in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour. This section shall not apply to ambulances, fire vehicles or police vehicles when on emergency trips.

(b) Slawson Street. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motorcycle on Slawson Street from the west side of South Helmer Avenue to the easterly boundary line of the Dolgeville Central School district in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour. This section shall not apply to ambulances, fire vehicles or police vehicles when on emergency trips.

(c) Beaver Street. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motorcycle on Beaver Street from the west side of South Helmer Avenue to the end of Beaver Street in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour. This section shall not apply to ambulances, fire vehicles or police vehicles when on emergency trips.

(d) Cline Street. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motorcycle on Cline Street from the south side of Slawson Street to the north side of Beaver Street in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour. This section shall not apply to ambulances, fire vehicles or police vehicles when on emergency trips.

(e) Signs. Adequate signs shall be erected in the vicinity of all Village playgrounds warning motorists of the approach thereto and the speed limits in the vicinity of said playgrounds, in addition to the speed limits on all streets identified herein.
