The following resolution was offered by Trustee Puznowski and sec. by Trustee Loucks. Ayes all.

A Local Law Amending the Zoning Law of the Village of Dolgeville to Allow the Raising and Use of Chickens

- I. FINDINGS. The Board of Trustees finds, subject to applicable law and reasonable regulation, that economic, subsistence and other consideration justify allowing Village of Dolgeville real property owners, and others lawfully occupying real property, to harbor and use what are commonly known as chickens and that the existing Zoning Law should be amended to reflect this finding.
- II. ZONING LAW, SECTION 26. Section 26(B) of the Zoning Law shall be amended to hereafter read as follows: “Within any district except AG, the only animals which are permitted are those defined herein as household pets excepting that upon issuance of a special permit pursuant to Section 17-10 and subject to any additional, or superseding, requirement or prohibitions of local or State law, a maximum of eight (8) pullets or hens of Livestock fowl identified as Gallus gallus domesticus, commonly known as female chickens, shall also be permitted.”
- III. EFFECT. This local law shall take effect upon its filing with the Secretary of State.
