## **Current Work:**

Weekly Green Waste Collection
 People are not following Green Waste Collection Policy.
 We are allowing piles to stay for a few weeks before we remove. We will be leaving notices upon removal.

- Weekly Checks of Sewers and Water Leaks
  1 Water leak this month at 112 S. Main-Faulty Gasket at the Incorporation was replaced as well as a new curb stop installed.
- Mowing & Weed eating of Village Parks & Trails as needed.
- Changing Garbage's at Parks Weekly.
- Daily 811 Requests
- Storm drain at Poplar St Repaired on 8/10/2021.
- Complaint on a Lamberson St Storm Drain has been coned and getting scheduled for repair.

# Water/Sewer

- Cut down Bank at Creek Line at Wastewater Plant and Delivered Trucks and Equipment as needed.
- Delivered 8" Pipe for Next Years Bypass for Water Reservoir.
- Leveling Pad for filter bags at Water for Next Year's Reservoir Cleaning.
- 1 Complaint from Helmer Ave (Sam Licari) We cleaned a plugged lateral and problem resolved.
- New Water Service Setup at 115 Spencer St.

#### Streets

- Cutting back sidewalks and Road edges.
- Sign complaint on Spencer St & Stewart St- Will call State to have Replaced.
- Mowing Roadsides
- Main Street Weed problem addressed.
- Per Homeowner request we pulled sidewalk at 16
  Cline St for Sidewalk replacement.
- 134 S. Main St-Ditching work. (a lot of material removed from ditch)
- Ditched on Helmer Ave-Removed Sod in ditch line to help water run.
- Ditched on tracks between Spencer and Main St.
  We removed a lot of standing water towards
  Spencer St. It needs to be partially filled in and graded.

# Garage

- Moved gas pump nozzle to corner of Garage for Safety. In the Winter it was dangerous for anyone to fuel due to falling ice.
- Started Rust Control on the 2009 Freightliner.
  Salt Spinner Rust Removed and Treated.
- Work is Continuing on 2012 Freightliner for Initial setup. The front tires were installed.
- F350 Was running poorly. We replaced all 4 "02 Sensors", it was Greased, had an oil change, and still has a Fuel Delivery Issue "Low Idle".
- Army Truck- Exhaust was Repaired. It needs a new exhaust System.
- Kodiak- Plow lights need to be removed to put on new truck. All other items of use have been removed and the Truck is ready for sale.
- 8500- All items of use have been removed and truck is ready for sale.
- Bobcat- Pulled information on an S76. Also, have trade in information for Current Bobcat. I would like to discuss "CHIPS" Purchase.

- Mowed Hillsides at Center Park and Baker St.
